Dates to Remember

Jan. 1 to May 31 - Burning Permits required once ground is no longer completely snow covered. Call 1-888-WISBURN or get your annual permit at www.dnr.wi.gov/wisburn.

March 16th - Temporary Class B Weight Limits were posted on town roads. Call Chairman Mike Bronk or Road Crew Foreman Jeff Herman for all exemption requests while roads are posted.

March 18th - Last day to register to vote by mail. After this date, voters may register in person at the Clerk's office until April 3rd at 5:00 pm or at the polls. Proof of residence is required for new applicants, name or address changes, and expired registrations.

March 23rd to April 3rd - Vote by absentee ballot in the Clerk's office, Monday to Friday from 8am to 5pm by appointment only.

April 1st - Dog Licenses Past Due. Subject to \$5 late fee per dog by WI Statute.

April 2nd - Last day to request absentee ballot by mail (April 3rd for military or indefinitely confined). Visit www.myvote.wi.gov or call the Town Clerk's office to request an application to vote absentee by mail.

April 7th - Election Day for Supreme Court Justice, Town Officers, School Board and referendum on Election of Chief Justice, 7am to 8pm. Photo Id NOT required.

April 21st - Annual Town Meeting, 7pm. Check out how we did in 2014 and share your ideas for 2015 and beyond!

May 2nd - Spring Clean Up, 8am - 2pm.

Annual "Spring Clean Up," 8 am to 2 pm at the Town Garage, 7252 6th Street, Custer. **Open to Stockton residents only** (proof of residence required). **Limit of Two Loads per Household.**

Items Accepted:

The Town will accept and dispose of used motor oil, furniture, mattresses, carpets; lawn mowers and small motors (oil & gas drained), electronics, recyclables, flattened cardboard and containers, certain major appliances, and paint dried in the container.

Items Not Accepted:

Yard waste, concrete, roofing materials, rocks and electronics not listed below.

Fees (Subject to Change):

FREE - Computers, printers, mice and keyboards, cables, chargers, stereos, VCRs, and DVD players.

\$15 - Small TVs 27" & under, computer monitors, and microwaves.

\$30 to \$40 - Consoles and TVs over 27"

\$25- Freezers, refrigerators, air conditioners, and dehumidifiers.

Tires - \$3 per car, \$10 per truck, or \$30 per tractor tire.

Call the Town Garage at (715) 592-4420 to make arrangements to drop off your motor oil ALL YEAR LONG.

If you have yard waste to dispose, try Zblewski Bros. LLC in Plover (715) 341-5350. Fees are \$5 to \$25/load. There is currently no charge for brush and wood.

Call the Portage County Transfer Facility in Plover, (715) 343-6297 or Best Buy in Plover, (715) 344-0566 for all of your special disposal needs year-round!

February 11 - In a demonstration of CN commitment to environmental sustainability, Kevin Soucie, CN Director of Governmental Affairs presented the Town of Stockton with a grant check in the amount of \$15,000 for the planting of trees and other parkland improvements at the Stockton Town Hall Park. The 11 acre site near the corner of Custer Road and 6th Street in Custer features a sledding area, yet it is largely undeveloped. Stockton Fire Chief Mike Spencer announced plans to improve the grading of the land and construct a training area in the northeast section where fire fighters can hone their fire

hose skills. Spencer hopes that the training area will make training more enjoyable, enhance team building, morale and recruitment, and inspire participation in competitive events with other fire departments. Plans are being considered to offer a small, open-air pavilion for picnicking that could also be used as a concessions area for a Firemen's picnic or competitive events. Once construction plans are finished, another phase of tree planting funded by the CN grant is slated to begin. Implements of Husbandry Law

On January 12, 2015, the Town of Stockton Town Board voted to accept the default option of Act 377 exempting Category B IOH (Implements of Husbandry) from axle weight limits, gross vehicle weight and axle limits when operating between fields and operated on the highway for a distance of ½ mile or less, and Class B road postings depending on the weight table available at <http://www.dot.wisconsin.gov/business/ag/weight.htm>.
